Below is a list of home learning activities. This term we would like you to complete four of the activities below (at least one of which must be writing based). These need to be returned to school by the end of term, although they can come in before as and when they are completed.

If you have any questions please do come and ask.

Write about a famous pirate from the past.	Draw/paint a pirate flag.	Create a wanted poster for a famous pirate.	Look around a garden/park and explore the different plants you see.	Write a short story about a pirate stranded on an island.
Go for a seasonal walk and create a drawing from what you saw.	Make a treasure chest that can open/close/locked.	Practice number bonds within 20 and doubles up to 20.	Write a book review about a pirate story.	Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Challenge yourself to do it backwards.

As well as these, the expectations for Reading remain the same. Children must read at home to an adult at least three times per week (ideally 5). Please record and sign their Reading Record after each read.

Here are some words that you could practise **reading** and **spelling** at home to support your learning in class:
