


Y5 Discovery Home Learning Menu

Discovery Topic: What a Wonderful World!

Below is a list of home learning activities for our term 1 topic 'What a Wonderful World'. We would like you to complete four of the activities (at least one of which must be a writing-based task). These need to be returned to school by the end of term, although they can come in as and when they are completed.

Creative projects should be photographed and sent in on the class email address and these will be shared with the class during assembly time.

<p>Make a papier mâché globe. You could even label the different continents and oceans.</p> 	<p>Test your knowledge of countries in Europe using the website below. When you have completed the quiz (possibly with the help of a map), print the screen and bring to school.</p> <p>http://world-geography-games.com/</p>	<p>Write a shape poem of an animal from a particular continent.</p> 	<p>Make your own travel brochure booklet to encourage someone to visit a particular country or continent. You could include flags, maps, facts and pictures.</p> 	<p>Design a menu that is inspired by a continent.</p> 
<p>Go for a walk around your local area. Explain your route by using compass directions (free compass app on most phones).</p> 	<p>Imagine you are an explorer who has just returned from an exotic location. Write a review of your trip.</p> 	<p>Create a word search related to our topic.</p> 	<p>Find 10 amazing facts about a great explorer and present them in a poster.</p> 	<p>Learn the song, 'What a Wonderful World' so that you can perform it to the class.</p> 

As well as these tasks, the expectations for reading remain the same. Children should read at home to an adult at least three times per week (ideally 5). Please record and sign their reading record after each read.

Multiplication Tables remain a focus and in year 5, children should be learning all times tables. Although we will not have formal multiplication tables home learning, children will be assessed on their multiplication tables each week. This may be orally, as part of a game or in a written format.

To help your child with their learning, each year group has created a 'how to' guide which is on the school's website. This is designed to help with the methods and some of the key vocabulary used in each year group.
