Discovery Topic: Once Upon A Time....

Below is a list of home learning activities. This term we would like you to complete four of the activities below (at least one of which must be writing based). These need to be returned to school by the end of term, although they can come in before as and when they are completed.

Talk to an older member of your family (grandparents) - What was their favourite story when they were your age?	Read the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Create a map of her journey through the woods and what she might see on the way to Grandma's house.	Talk to an older member of your family (grandparents) - what was life like when they were your age? Write down a list of things that were different.	Castles are a typical setting for a fairy tale. If your family lived in a castle what would your family flag look like? Design a family flag. Include all the things that are important to you.	Investigate the different materials that you can find around the house. Create a list of items that are made of wood, metal, plastic etc.
Practise ordering the days of the week and the months of the year	The 3 Little Pigs have been living in the same house now for a very long time. They are not so little anymore! Design, label and maybe even make a new house for them. Which materials will you use and why?	Find some information about recycling. What objects do you recycle at home? What materials are they?	Goldilocks' loves porridge! What do you like to eat for breakfast? Write a set of instructions on how to make your favourite breakfast.	Go for a winter walk and create a seasonal drawing.

As well as these, the expectations for Reading remain the same. Children must read at home to an adult at least three times per week (ideally 5). Please record and sign their Reading Record after each read.
