Discovery Topic: Ice

Year:2

Term: 3

This term we will be learning about ice. This will include cold places in the world, explorers who have travelled to these places, what we would need to survive on an exploration and about the different animals we might encounter (as well as finding out about animals from the past). We would like you to complete a minimum of four of the activities below (at least one of which must be a piece of writing). These need to be returned to school by the end of term, although photos of your creations should be emailed to the class email address for us to look at, as and when they are completed.

Make your own igloo model	Write a diary entry as if you are an Inuit.	Create an Ice Age in a box model.	Write an adventure story about a penguin	Create your own brand new animal that could have lived in the Ice Age
Make a symmetrical snowflake	Research a famous winter Olympian/ Paralympian	Explore different states of water (take some pictures and describe what you saw)	Write a winter poem	Write a review about a film linked to ice – e.g. Ice Age, Happy Feet, Frozen

As well as these, the expectations for reading remain the same. Children should read at home to an adult at least three times per week (ideally 5). Please record and sign their Reading Record after each read.



Remember that we would love the children to read for pleasure as well, so whatever they read, jot it down.

Number bonds, counting and multiplication tables remain a focus and in your year group, children should be confident learning and revising the multiplication tables 2X, 5X and 10X and associated division facts. Although we will not have any formal multiplication/number bond tests, the children will be applying these facts in all of their Maths lessons.
