Topic	Endangered Animals: Can We Save the Tiger?	Year Group	6	Term 2
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Subject Focus:	Geography, Science and English
Outline: We will be using the text "Can We Save the Tiger?" which explores a range of mammals and sea creatures that are either endangered, critically endangered or extinct. We will explore their country/continent of origin and use that knowledge to understand about adaptations and evolution, as well as human impact, both positive and negative.	

The key vocabulary that will be taught in this topic:
Biomes, maps, atlases, globes, climate, evolution, classification, adaptation, extinct, endangered

Key knowledge that will be taught in this topic:
Be able to understand key aspects of physical geography including: climate zones and biomes. Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied. Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.
